

Offering fast, tender-crisp results, a steam oven can be a convenient, health-conscious alternative to a microwave.

Built-In Refrigerator

Built-in appliances give your kitchen a smooth, integrated look. In this remodeled kitchen, the refrigerator is nestled into custom cabinetry, which provides storage directly above and to the side of the fridge. Double Ovens

Typically stacked and built directly into perimeter cabinetry, double ovens provide a sleek look and added convenience. This kitchen feature offers a main oven you can use without bending over and a secondary oven for plate warming and additional baking. Separating the ovens from the burners also lets you install a cooktop in a kitchen island or elsewhere, opening up new floor-plan possibilities.

High-Style Faucet

Kitchen faucets are made in dozens of finishes in myriad styles and sizes, so you can easily find one that suits your aesthetic. Offering double the style, these two kitchen faucets take full advantage of the extra-wide sink. The shiny brass finish and streamlined shapes repeat on cabinetry hardware and sconces above the sink for a cohesive look.

Island Cooktop

With ovens located elsewhere, the cooktop can be placed on the kitchen island. When this kitchen feature is built into a large island, you also get generous work surfaces and room for amenities below, such as a warming drawer or storage for pots and pans. Opt for a statement-making range hood or install a downdraft exhaust system for a more streamlined look.

Ample Kitchen Lighting

Outfit a kitchen with layers of light and consider multiple fixtures to cover every area. Recessed ceiling fixtures offer ambient light that fills the room. Pendant lights can provide style and task lighting (try this Better Homes & Gardens Clear Glass Wall Light, \$39, Walmart) above an island or sink. Don't forget under-cabinet lights for proper task lighting on every countertop.

Bar Sink

A secondary sink can be a functional addition to a large kitchen or in an adjacent pantry area. Often smaller than the main sink, it provides a convenient spot to rinse vegetables, ice down drinks, or fill a pot with water. Consider a bar sink for a second prep station, a butler's pantry, home theater, or basement rec room.

Trash and Recycling

Make life easier by planning a handy trash and recycling area. Incorporate separate bins or containers for sorting recyclables, compost, and other waste. Consider installing this kitchen feature under the sink, in a pantry, or in a handy pull-out drawer.

Pot Filler

Eliminate the need for hauling heavy pots of water across the kitchen. A pot filler is a smart kitchen feature that can go wherever you can run a cold water line. Here, a swing-out faucet is mounted high enough on the kitchen backsplash to provide a flow of water to a big pot of pasta or soup.

Coffee Bar

Transform a kitchen alcove into a home coffee station for a bright start to your mornings. This small coffee bar includes an espresso machine, a drip coffee maker, and storage for mugs and saucers. Use nearby drawers or shelves to house coffee grounds, sugar, stirring spoons, and other essentials. A narrow spot like this provides dedicated functionality out of the way of the main cooking area.

On-Counter Garage

Use an on-counter garage to house appliances you often use but don't always want in plain sight. Here, an appliance garage opens to reveal a coffee maker, which can be pulled out onto the counter space in front when in use. An outlet inside the cabinet keeps cords contained.

Corner Storage

Consider kitchen features that take advantage of space that would otherwise be wasted. This corner lazy Susan, for example, turns potentially dead space into usable storage. The unit's two-tiered carousel shelving allows easy access to stowed items, such as mixing bowls and air-tight storage containers (we like this Better Homes & Gardens Flip-Tite Rectangular Storage Container, \$10, Walmart).

Deep Drawers

A deep drawer near the kitchen range provides easy access to large pots and pans. Here, a spacious drawer houses cookware directly beneath the cooktop. A shallow pull-out within the drawer holds lids that correspond to the cookware below.

Full Extension Drawers

Hardware that allows drawers to slide open all the way makes it much easier to get objects in and out. Look for full extension drawer hardware when you're shopping for new cabinetry or upgrading what you have. Drawers with high sides and backs can keep stacks of items neat and orderly.

Plush Towels

No matter your decorating style, Beryl says every bathroom needs plush towels. "Having a super soft towel after a shower feels like a much-needed hug. Pottery Barn's classic organic towels are amazing and come in all sizes and great classic colors."

Beryl is also a fan of sconces. "Having an alternative to overhead lighting is not only good for ambiance, it is practical for avoiding the shadows that overhead downlights can cause."

Electric Outlets

Whether you need to charge your electric toothbrush, blow out your hair, or plug in your phone, a bathroom without enough outlets (or poorly placed ones) can feel frustrating and inefficient.

Ovadia advises having one above the counter by the sink as well as one inside the medicine cabinet. "Installing outlets inside the medicine closet provides a hidden solution for charging devices while maintaining a clean and uncluttered aesthetic," he explains.

Toilet Paper Holder with a Small Shelf

Let's admit it—we all check our phones while using the toilet. Ovadia advises swapping out your current toilet paper holder for one with a top shelf for your phone. While this may sound fancy and expensive, there are inexpensive yet aesthetic options available from Amazon.

6. Telescopic Dusters to Clean Hard-to-Reach Spots


